With so much character and prestige, it's no wonder that Canterbury is one of the most popular destinations in the south.

If you're interested in British history, you're spoilt for choice. You can find a Roman city wall (rebuilt in the 14th Century), the oldest school in England (The King's School) and ancient preserved mosaics.

From anywhere in Canterbury you are no more that 20 minutes to the coastline. Steeped in history and heritage, Canterbury is the perfect destination for a weekend away.

Getting to Canterbury by car

Travelling around Canterbury and the surrounding area is easy thanks to the Romans! They developed an excellent route network around East Kent with Canterbury at its heart - the Roman capital of Kent.

Canterbury district has excellent road links with the M20 (M25/M26) and M2 motorways providing easy links to London and its airports. The A2 and A260 connect Canterbury with the port of Dover and the Eurotunnel terminal in Cheriton near Folkestone. Canterbury Park & Ride is the greenest, cheapest and fastest way to get to the heart of the city and helps more than one million shoppers, commuters and visitors a year beat city centre congestion.

Day one

Day two

Day two in Canterbury could be spent discovering the city's world heritage sites. Canterbury Cathedral, together with St Augustine's Abbey and St Martin's Church make up Canterbury's World Heritage Site.

Start the day with a visit to Canterbury cathedral, home to a Romanesque Crypt, dating back to the 11th century, a 12th century early Gothic Quire and a 14th Century Perpendicular Nave. Beautiful medieval stained glass windows illustrate miracles and stories associated with St Thomas. With a range of guided tours and audio tours available, a visit to Canterbury cathedral is a must.

Finish your day in Canterbury with a trip to St Augustine's Abbey originally created as a burial place for the Anglo-Saxon kings of Kent The impressive Abbey is situated outside the city walls and is sometimes missed by visitors. At the Abbey, you can also enjoy the museum and interactive audio tour.
