Day one

Historic Rochester

In 2012, Medway will be celebrating the bi-centenary of the birth of Charles Dickens. Dickens' most impressionable childhood days were spent in Medway. The historic city of Rochester inspired the author so much that he featured it in his work more than any city, other than London.

Visitors can follow in Dickens footsteps on a costumed guided walking tour of Rochester. This exciting 90-minute walking tour takes in the beautiful buildings the author immortalised in his books.

After the tour, why not take time to visit the heritage attractions that can be found on the historic High Street. Explore Rochester Cathedral, take in the spectacular views from the top of Rochester Castle and finish with a visit to the Guildhall Museum and discover the area's connections with Charles Dickens.

Make the most of your visit by stopping for lunch in one of the many fine restaurants located on the High Street.

Rochester hosts a full calendar of colourful and lively events throughout the year. These include the traditional Sweeps festival, open-air concerts in the castle gardens and the famous twice-yearly Dickens Festivals.

Day two

Chatham Maritime

Start your day with a visit to The Historic Dockyard Chatham. Discover over 400 years of maritime history in one of the world's most complete dockyards of the Age of Sail and meet characters from the past.

Set in 80 acres, the maritime galleries and attractions will excite and entertain you – whatever your age. Make your own rope on the Victorian ropery tour, be gripped by stories of life aboard the three historic warships and visit No.1 Smithery the exciting new cultural centre featuring world-class maritime models, arts and objects from two national museums and a contemporary exhibition space.

From the dockyard, it's the briefest of journeys to the exciting Dickens World at Chatham Maritime. Dickens World takes visitors on a fascinating journey through Dickens' lifetime as they step back into Dickensian England and are immersed in the urban streets, sounds and smells of the 19th century.

Several restaurants are located within the Dickens World visitor complex to stop for lunch.
