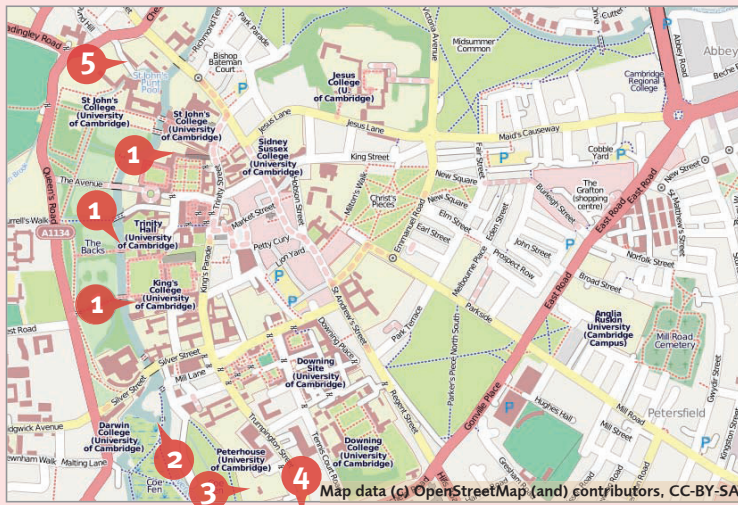


Cambridge

1 Cambridge University

• **King's College:** King's College Chapel is a masterpiece of English craftsmanship and the most recognisable building in Cambridge. It's part of one of the oldest Cambridge colleges and shares a wonderful sense of history and tradition with the rest of the university.

• **Saint John's College:** founded in 1511 by Lady Margaret Beaufort, mother of King Henry VII. The second largest of the constituent Colleges of the University of Cambridge. The college is famous for its neo-gothic Bridge of Sighs.

• **Trinity College:** this is the college of Sir Isaac Newton. The Library was designed by Christopher Wren and is said to be one of his best works outside of London.

3 Fitzwilliam Museum

The museum contains fascinating Egyptian, Greek, Roman and other antiquities, an internationally-renowned collection of European paintings, drawings and prints, some fine furniture and sculpture, coins and medals, manuscripts and printed books.

4 Cambridge University Botanic Gardens

This historic landscape features the Rock Garden, representing the alpine plants, the Winter and Dry Gardens; tropical rainforest and seasonal displays in the glasshouses; a lake teeming with birdlife, and the unique systematic beds, representing more than 80 families of flowering plants. The Garden also boasts many important plant collections including lavender, hardy geraniums, British wild plants and the finest collection of trees.

5 Kettle's Yard

A major collection of 20thC paintings and sculpture exhibited in a house of unique character. Paintings and sculpture are interlaced with furniture, glass, ceramics and natural objects. Ede's (the founder of Kettle Yard) vision for the house was of a place that was not an art gallery or museum, nor.....simply a collection of works of art reflecting my taste or the taste of a given period. It is, rather, a continuing way of life from these last fifty years, in which stray objects, stones, glass, pictures, sculpture, in light and in space, have been used to make manifest the underlying stability....'

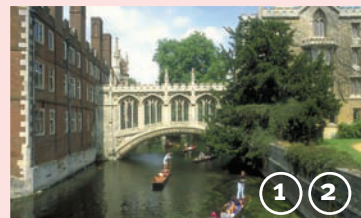
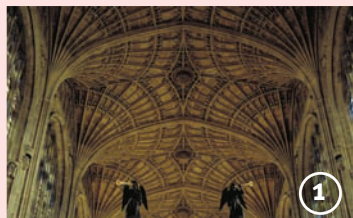
