Windsor



You can't say the word Windsor without conjuring up images of the world's oldest and largest inhabited castle, royalty, horse racing, the changing of the guard, the River Thames and Eton College. Windsor thrives on its royal patronage, rich cultural heritage, stunning architecture and beautiful natural scenery. Add to this an abundance of quaint one-of-a-kind shops and a culinary scene headed by the likes of Heston Blumenthal and you'll have a reasonable idea of the treats in store for you in Windsor.

First time visitors to Windsor are amazed and delighted at the proximity of the castle to the town. It was Henry VIII's favourite residence and HM The Queen spends most weekends here, away from her 'office' at Buckingham Palace. The castle covers the equivalent of 269 tennis courts and is more like a fortified town.

Wherever you go the River Thames is near. Time spent enjoying the sights and sounds of the river on a leisurely boat trip or from the Thames path should feature in everyone's to-do list.

One of the oldest schools in England, Eton has educated 18 former British Prime Ministers including the Duke of Wellington, current Prime Minister David Cameron and Princes William and Harry. The School Dress, which dates from the 1850s, still consists of a black tailcoat and waistcoat and pin-striped trousers. Visitors can experience the beauty and traditions of the College on guided tours

The Royal Borough is home to Bray; the only village in the world with two Three-Michelin Starred restaurants; Heston Blumenthal's 'The Fat Duck' and Michel Roux's 'The Waterside Inn'. There are gastro-pubs, hotel dining, bistros and cafes to suit all tastes and pockets. Royal Windsor Shopping and King Edward Court provide a wonderful combination of luxury stores and high street favourites.
